INSTRUCTIONS

General

1. The term "psychotropic substance" means any substance included in either Schedule I, II, III or IV of the 1971 Convention. These schedules are amended from time to time according to a procedure established in article 2. The updated list of psychotropic substances ("Green List") is annexed to the present form.

2. The psychotropic substances are referred to either by the International Nonproprietary Names or by the other nonproprietary or trivial names which appear in the Schedules annexed to the 1971 Convention. The chemical name of each psychotropic substance will be found in these Schedules.

3. The statistical data entered on this form should represent the weight of the pure anhydrous base of each psychotropic substance, excluding the weight of any non-psychotropic substance which may be combined or mixed with it. Part three of the Green List contains, for certain salts, the pure anhydrous base equivalents.

4. With regard to the psychotropic substances listed in Schedules I and II, the weight should be reported in **grams**. For substances listed in Schedules III and IV, the weight should be reported in **kilograms**.

5. In the case of preparations containing two or more psychotropic substances, the quantities of each of the component substances should be entered in the **appropriate column**.

6. The actual quantity of a psychotropic substance put up in an ampoule is generally greater than the ampoule's nominal content; the statistics should take into account the actual quantity of the psychotropic substance contained in the ampoule and not the ampoule's nominal content.

7. The term "region" means any part of a State which, pursuant to article 28 of the 1971 Convention, is treated as a separate entity for the purposes of this Convention. The term "region" corresponds to the term "territory" used in the International Narcotics Control Board's other statistical forms.

Quantity manufactured

8. Report the total quantity of a psychotropic substance that has been manufactured domestically from 1 January to 31 December. Quantities of **preparations** manufactured containing a psychotropic substance should not, however, be included in the figure of manufacture.

Quantity utilized for the manufacture of preparations exempted from certain measures of control in accordance with article 3, paragraphs 2 and 3, of the 1971 Convention

9. For each of the psychotropic substances included in Schedules II and III, indicate the total quantity utilized for the manufacture of preparations exempted from certain measures of control in accordance with article 3, paragraphs 2 and 3, of the 1971 Convention. This quantity should include the total amount placed in process of manufacture during the year to which the statistics relate, even if the manufacturing process has not been completed at the end of the year.

Quantity utilized for the manufacture of non-psychotropic substances or products

10. For each of the psychotropic substances included in Schedules II, III and IV, indicate the quantity utilized for the manufacture of non-psychotropic substances or products in accordance with article 4, paragraph (b), of the 1971 Convention. This quantity should include the total amount placed in process of manufacture during the year to which the statistics relate, even if the manufacturing process has not been completed at the end of the year.

Manufacturers' stocks

11. For each of the psychotropic substances included in Schedules I and II, indicate the quantity held in stock by manufacturers on 31 December of the year to which the statistics relate.

Imports and exports

12. Statistics should be based, as far as possible, on actual movement across frontiers.

13. *"Imported from"*: for each of the substances included in Schedules I and II, give the name of the exporting country or "region" whose competent authorities have issued the export authorization according to article 12, paragraph 1, of the 1971 Convention.

"Exported to": for each of the substances included in Schedules I and II, give the name of the importing country or "region" whose competent authorities have issued the import authorization according to article 12, paragraph 1, of the 1971 Convention.

Import is also intended to include, as far as possible, entrance of goods from abroad into a bonded warehouse, free port or free zone. Export is also intended to include dispatch of goods abroad from a warehouse, free port or free zone, although such transactions may not ordinarily be treated by the national customs laws as technical import and export; but care should be taken to ensure that goods passing the customs from a bonded warehouse, free port or free zone, into the country or "region" itself shall not be treated as imports, and goods transferred from the country or "region" itself into a bonded warehouse, free port or free zone situated in the country or "region" shall not be treated as exports.

However, if a consignment passes in transit through a country or "region" to another country, it should not be considered by the country or "region" through which it passes as an import or export, even if the consignment is placed temporarily in a bonded warehouse, free port or free zone.

Goods returned by a country or "region" for any reason whatever to the original exporting country or "region" shall be entered as an export by the former and as an import by the latter.
